with Fr. Christopher Pedersen- Principal

Q: What is one of your favorite memories from your days in the seminary? A: The liturgy. The beauty and splendor of divine worship brings one closer to the majesty of God than any other thing on earth.

Q: Name a person in your life that inspires you the most? A: Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre, our venerable founder. No other figure in our age has acted out of love for Holy Mother Church, with such faith, prudence and courage in the face of persecution, even from within.

Q: What do you think are the most important qualities of a successful principal? A: The main role of a principal is to be a father. Together with the love of his children he must join the wisdom to direct and lead all to their goal which is eternal salvation. He sets the tone most conducive to this work of formation.

"I really enjoyed the peace and quiet of the day because I was able to do some deep thinking." - 10th Grade Girl


"I liked my Day of Recollection because it gave me the opportunity to step back from my everyday duties and reflect on the purpose of those duties." - 11th Grade Boy
